## The Right to Vote:

## **Digital Resources for Teachers**

2020 marked the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversaries of two of the most important suffrage amendments to the Constitution, the 15<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> Amendments. As the past year has shown, the right to vote represents a cornerstone of democracy that carries meaning beyond its fundamental importance in representative government. Educating students about the struggle for voting rights and the meaning of suffrage is of vital importance.
